Mizoram is a land of rolling hills, valleys, rivers and lakes and more than 84% of the state is covered with forests. Tucked away in the thickets of green on the southern tip of Northeast India, its is a nature lover's paradise, and has abundance of attractions for those who are interested in nature, culture and adventure.

Mizoram, with its lush landscapes, rich cultural heritage, and strategic location, holds immense potential for development and growth. Its rich biodiversity and favorable climate, offers tremendous opportunities for sustainable agriculture and horticulture. It has a large opportunity to set up different kinds of agro-based industries as about 87 % of the entire State is covered by forests. It has a rich tradition of handloom and handicrafts, renowned for their intricate designs and vibrant colours. It is known as the "Bamboo State of India" due to its abundant bamboo resources, which occupies 30% of the total land area of the State, and offers opportunities for investments in bamboo- based industries. It also has significant potential for hydro power generation due to its numerous

rivers and hilly terrain. Additionally, the strategic location of Mizoram provides access to neighbouring states and countries, opening up a broader consumer base.

Mizoram's scenic landscapes, rich cultural heritage, warm hospitality a rich blend of natural resources, skilled human capital. investor friendly policies with east of doing buisnes, and attractive incentives make Mizoram one of the favorite destination for investment.

We are going to have some excellent presentation on tourism and investment opportunities in the State.

Japan and India share a bond that is built on shared values, economic partnership, and a commitment to peace and development. Relationship between our two countries has transformed into Special Strategic and Global partnership which was launched in 2014 and this year we are celebrating its 10th anniversary. The Act East Policy, along with various state-specific initiatives, is designed to facilitate and promote such collaborations.
