This constitution has also provided India the necessary framework to make notable achievements in diverse fields, including atomic energy, space science, agriculture, bio-technology and, of course, information technology, for which India is well-known the world over. It is a matter of pride for an Ambassador to say with confidence that the economic and scientific transformation India achieved was under a constitution which establishes a sovereign, secular, democratic, republic and guarantees Justice, social economic and political, liberty of thought expression belief faith and worship; equality of status and of opportunity.

India today is a land of billion opportunities. India has overtaken China as the most populous country in the world. But we are proud that we govern ourselves as a sovereign democratic republic. Every day it is the constitution of India that gets celebrated when a democratic election takes place in some part of India. Now we are witnessing the biggest election ever held in the history of the world. One billion electorate. A festival of democracy.

In this period of Amrit Kaal, when our nation is marching towards becoming a developed country by 2047, it is all the more important that we recall the contributions of the founding fathers of our constitution and pay homage to them. The best homage we can pay is to rededicate ourselves to the cause of our constitution and also to make our own contributions in our march towards Amrit Kaal.

2023 has been a great year in our India – Japan relationship. We began the 2024 with a series of meetings. We are currently celebrating India – Japan Year of Tourism 2024 with the theme 'Connecting Himalayas with Mount Fuji'.
